Greetings,

Last year at this time I wrote in my newsletter article that I would never have imagined face masks and Covid positivity rates becoming part of daily life. Here we are one year later and although the Covid strain has changed, it remains part of daily life.

We currently have eight Covid positive members and two Covid positive teammates. Three of our member living units are in yellow zones, although barring any new cases, Pods D and F are scheduled to be out of quarantine on October 4.

We have been very fortunate to have contained our current Covid outbreak to one living unit. It is a daily battle to stay ahead of all the potential threats that can quickly turn the tide. As of the end of September, we continue to conduct twice weekly Covid testing for fully vaccinated teammates and every other day testing for non-vaccinated staff. This testing is in addition to temperature taking and a health questionnaire that must be answered every time a teammate reports for duty. We continue to enforce and double our efforts to keep our members and teammates safe. I totally understand how frustrating this pandemic continues to be for all of us; members, families and our teammates. I am very proud of the vigilance our teammates have shown and their daily efforts to follow procedures and safeguards that have been put in place. We will get through this and come out stronger on the other side.
