The COVID-19 Pandemic has certainly been a challenging "storm" that our entire country has faced together. At the Central Nebraska

Veterans' Home, we closed our campus to protect our members from this deadly virus in mid-March of 2020, which has now been over a year of seclusion from families, visitors, volunteers, entertainers, and the general public.

We basically "sheltered in place", implementing a variety of directed precautionary measures to minimize the opportunity for the virus to get into the facility or to lessen its spread if it did. However, due to the nature of this virus, staff would sometimes by "asymptomatic" and unfortunately this resulted in some outbreaks during this past year. The majority of the members who became ill made it through their individual "storm" and safely to the other side. We deeply grieve the loss of those individuals that did not. Throughout it all, we faced the battle together.

The "storm" of the COVID-19 virus has slowly abated (although we can't be sure the "storm" is quite over yet!). As it recedes, we will make exciting transitions!

One of the most important milestones we achieved was the vaccination of our members and staff in the past few months, which has led us to the next milestone of being able to safely allow a limited number of pre-scheduled visitors in to see their loved one in person. This first major transition is being implemented just as the April edition of the newsletter is being completed. We are transitioning from scheduled "Window Visits" to scheduled "In-Room, In-Person Visits"!!!!

Members and families have been notified on how they can pre-schedule their in-room visits (our campus is still closed to the public, with the excep-



tion of these scheduled visits). The reunions have been so heartwarming and we so thrilled that we are able to offer this opportunity! Our hope is that we can continue to lessen restrictions throughout the upcoming months, so stay "tuned" for updates!

This Pandemic has deeply affected everyone at the Central Nebraska Veterans' Home. We are deeply grateful for our teammates that have been unwavering in their dedication of providing quality care and services to our members throughout his challenge. We are grateful for our families, volunteers and advocates that have supported us in so many ways. And we are grateful for our members, who have demonstrated how to face adversity with strength and grace!
