"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness." - The United States Declaration of Independence, adopted by the Committee of the Whole of the Second Continental Congress on July 4, 1776.

As we celebrate our Nation's freedom throughout the week leading up to the 4th of July, it is an important time to also reflect on what liberty means to each of us individually, and what our individual responsibilities are in relation to our liberty. Interestingly enough, neither the Declaration of Independence, nor the Constitution of the United States, use the word "freedom".

Freedom is defined by Webster's Dictionary primarily and simply in terms of the lack of restraint or barriers to action. On the other hand, "Liberty" is a form of freedom, but also carries the implication of responsibility and duty, under the rule of law, without depriving anyone else of their freedom. It implies an attachment to a greater whole, whether that be as part of a society or a philosophical belief system. It seems clear that the founders of our Nation purposely put some restraints on people's freedom to create an orderly and lawabiding society. The Bill of Rights eventually spelled out our freedom within these constraints.

As individuals, we have the right to form our own opinion on what "freedom" or "liberty" means to each of us, and what choices we make accordingly. The ideals set forth in 1776 still ring true today.

Our Nation has faced many *challenges* throughout history, the most recent being the *COVID-19 Global Pandemic*. Balancing everyone's rights during this turbulent time has been a difficult process, and we have all experienced the changes first hand. From being in a "*State of Emergency*" in our state starting on March 13, 2020 to having it finally expire on June 30, 2021, we have faced unique circumstances that will be *part of our life experience* that can be shared with generations to come.

Long-term care facilities follow federal CMS guidelines, so even though our state is no longer in a "State of Emergency", our facility will continue to have certain precautionary measures in place, as directed by these federal agencies. We will continue to move slowly but surely towards our more "normal" routines, as these restrictions gradually lessen.

One of those steps being taken is a process to allow a limited number of volunteers back into the facility, which is being implemented this month. We look forward to welcoming both our *organizational and independent volunteers*, as they assist us with recreational programming and a variety of other tasks! This may look like a small step, but in reality will be a huge leap forward!

To quote Nebraska's Governor, Pete Ricketts, "Together we powered through this difficult chapter with strength, grit, and resilience."




Merrymakers Concerts Are Member Favorites!
