Starting with the visits, a group of select employees of the Central Office, including Director Hilgert, conducted a mock survey of our facility, with the intention to identify "in-house" any non-compliance regulatory issues that could be corrected before the USVA surveyors arrive in March for the annual survey. Also, the State Fire Marshal conducted his annual Life Safety Code survey, which identified minor issues that were corrected immediately, allowing Central Nebraska Veterans' Home (CNVH) to receive its safe environment certificate for another year.

Speaking of annual surveys, it is important to mention that CNVH received its 2024 full license certification from the US Department of Veterans Affairs.

Regarding the celebrations that took place in November, a very important one was Veterans Day on November 11th. On that day, CNVH was honored to organize a celebratory event in Freedom



Hall, having guests from the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) from Kearney as well as current and former members of the National Guard who cel-

ebrated this year 20 years since their return from the war in Iraq. The administrator read Governor Pillen's Proclamation for this special day while all flags were flown at the Veterans' Memorial in honor of those that answered America's call to service and sacrifice!




sota. He was a chiropractor in Minnesota and then moved to North Platte and took over a practice there.
