







Merrymakers—Mike McCracken

The featured singer from the Merrymakers this month was Mike McCracken. He was playing a Dobro Guitar, also known as a resonator guitar.

This differs from a standard guitar primarily due to its resonator, a metal cone that amplifies the sound and its playing style which often uses a slide on the strings. The Dobro gets its name from the brothers who created the instrument the "Dopyera Brothers" and they fused that into Dobro.

Mike played the Dobro while it was sitting on his lap as he worked his way through songs from the 50's, 60's, and 70's. He played songs such as Can't Help Falling in Love by Elvis, He'll Have to Go by Jim Reeves, and King of the Road by Roger Miller.

Mike was an excellent performer and had members singing along with every song. The music he played was well known and very popular. With a charming personality, Mike was a delight to listen to and made the performance one to remember.

Member Trust Funds

Did you know that the money in your Trust Fund here at CNVH earns interest? In May, you earned 2.73% APR interest on all the money kept in your Trust Fund. The amount of interest you earned is

based on the amount of money you keep in the Trust Fund on a daily basis or your average daily balance, not the balance at the end of the month.

I know a lot of our members keep outside bank accounts and that is great! I hope that you are earning interest in your outside account. I know

outside accounts have perks like debit cards, that CNVH is unable to provide to access your Trust Fund. For those of you that are looking at consolidating accounts or wanting to change your banking institution, we provide access to your money through our Member Finance Desk.

You can purchase items from online retailers through Andrea or Connie with purchase requests. You also have access to charge against your Trust Fund at the Foxhole convenience store. So please remember that the larger your average daily balance in the Trust Fund, the more interest you receive monthly.


Thomas Pribnow Fishing Tournament Awards

The 2nd place award was Wilfred Medinger with a bluegill weighing 1.2 pounds. The 3rd place master angler was


Greg Ewing with a catch of a bluegill weighing 1.0 pounds.
