

This activity was sponsored by the VFW Auxiliary. The members also enjoyed visiting with all the volunteers that




came out and helped celebrate with them. The afternoon was enjoyed with smiles, laughter, and of course a full tummy!

We had volunteers from the American Legion Auxiliary and the UNK Health Science club come out and help with this special event. As members arrived, the UNK Health Science Club












