Visitation:

Visitors who would like to visit a specific member no longer need to use the online sign-up system. NVH can accommodate up to two visitors per member at a time in member rooms. Visitors must continue to go through the screening process and should not visit if they are not feeling well. Masks must be worn at all times in all areas of the building. Visits are permitted outside, in member rooms (with consideration given to the member's roommate) or in designated visitation areas. Visits must be limited to visiting the member in question. If sharing food with a member during a visit, this may be done in the member's room (if appropriate distancing allows) or in designated visitation areas only. Visitors may not eat with members in the dining room at this time.

If more than two people would like to visit a member at the same time, please contact NVH in advance by phone to schedule a visit so we can ensure we have an appropriate space available for the visit and staff available to help if needed.
