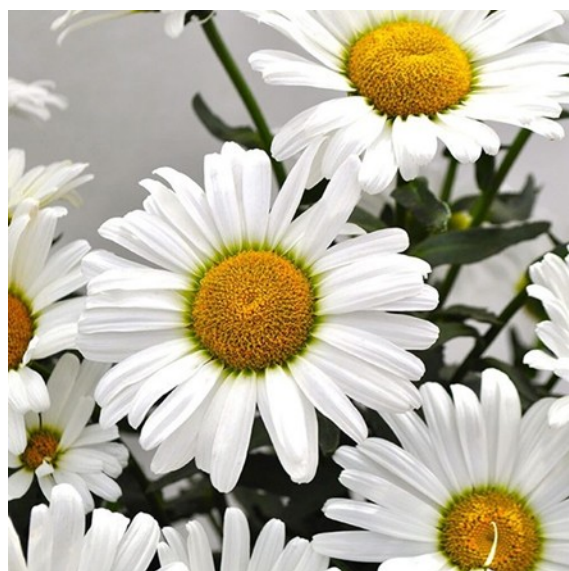

Garden Corner

Shasta Daisies



If you take a stroll to the “backyard” of the Veterans’ Home and look towards the gazebo, you will find Shasta daisies blooming! There are over 20,000 species of daisies in the massive Asteraceae (sunflower) family, all of them recognizable with a composite head of petals and a center disc. The popular Shasta cultivar is one of the most easily identifiable and dependable perennial flowers grown in eastern Nebraska gardens. They typically begin blooming in late May, reach peak color in July, and can continue flowering into early fall if spent blooms are regularly removed.

These hardy plants thrive best in full sun, reaching about two to three feet tall in clumps that slowly spread over time. In eastern Nebraska’s hot summers and cold winters, they are generally easy to grow, just deep watering during dry spells, deadheading to encourage continued blooms, and dividing every two or three years to prevent overcrowding and weak flowering. They are loved by many gardeners not only for their long bloom season and low-maintenance care, but also because they attract butterflies and pollinators while making excellent cut flowers for indoor arrangements.
