Members at ENVH celebrated Independence Day with watermelon, fireworks, and a very patriotic musical performance by Tim Javorsky.



Garden Corner



Brown-Eyed Susan / Black-Eyed Susan

(Botanical Name: Rudbeckia Triloba / Rudbeckia Hirta)

The Brown-eyed Susan (*Rudbeckia triloba*) and the Black-eyed Susan (*Rudbeckia hirta*) are both types of *Rudbeckias* in the plant family, *Asteraceae*. Native to the United States, there are 20+ species and countless varieties and hybrid cultivars of *Rudbeckia*. Individual flowers in this group appear daisy-like in shape with various colors of petals surrounding a dark center. The highly adaptable Susans bloom in Nebraska from late June until frost, making them one of our longest blooming perennials. They can be found in dry and mesic prairies, roadsides, railroads, pastures and in some dry woodlands. Further, Susans can fill a similar niche to thistles and other problematic weeds, providing effective competition. They also provide pollen and nectar to bees, butterflies, native flies, wasps, and beetles. Some insect species that use the Susans include carpenter bees, sweat bees, leafcutter bees, long-horned bees, soldier beetles and bee flies.

Look for the Black-eyed and Brown eyed Susans that are planted around the perimeter of the Purple Heart Garden. You will also find them in the gardens by the gazebo.
