## **Stella D' Oro Reblooming Daylily**

**(Botanical Name: Hemerocallis Stella D' Oro)**

Stella is a compact perennial, early to bloom and easy to care for, many say it is the No.1 daylily because of its ability to continue to rebloom. Rich, golden yellow blooms with ruffled edges come in strong in late spring to early summer and reblooming again later in the season, August into the fall. Often called the “perfect perennial” because of its numerous qualities: showy flowers, drought tolerance, heat stress immunity, and low care requirements; but thorough watering is required to ensure its foliage remains attractive.

**A fun fact: Don't confuse them with the true lilies:** Daylilies are not really lilies. In fact, they are quite different. As you know, true lilies grow on tall stems with flowers at the top. Daylily flower stems (called scapes) are generally much shorter, and grow from a fountain of grass-like foliage at ground level. Daylilies are members of the genus, Hemerocallis, not Liliium, which is the genus name of true lilies. It is a great choice for edging the front of the garden, as you can see in the Purple Heart Garden at the main entrance.
