

Poinsettia Euphorbia pulcherrima

We all know poinsettias but what is the meaning of poinsettias? Also known as the Christmas Star and Christmas Flower, it's said that poinsettias' association with Christmas comes from a Mexican legend. The story goes that a child, with no means for a grander gift, gathered humble weeds from the side of the road to place at the church alter on Christmas Eve. As the congregation witnessed a Christmas miracle, the weeds turned into brilliant red and green flowers. The flower was named after Joel Roberts Poinsett, first United States ambassador to Mexico and the amateur botanist who introduced the flower to the US in 1825. While considered by the ancient Aztecs to be symbols of purity, in today's language of flowers, red, white or pink poinsettias, the December birth flower, symbolizes good cheer and success and are said to bring wishes of mirth and celebration. Enjoy the holiday season admiring this beautiful flowering plant!
