Even as the restrictions are lifted on some activities, crowd size is still being limited and social distancing continues to be requested. These *restrictions will have* an impact on the types of activities and outings we can offer to members this summer, so those having questions or special requests should contact Activity staff for updates and further information.

We can still enjoy the summer through a variety of outdoor activities available at the facility. Members at the Central Nebraska Veterans' Home are blessed with a beautiful campus that includes outdoor courtvards for every Home. Members can go outside to enjoy the *fresh air and sunshine*, as long as they practice social distancing



and wear their masks. Those that enjoy *gardening* have been provided plants and flowers in the garden planters and tubs located in these courtyards, so that they can

water and nurture their plants. Some of these planters are "community" gardens, for all to assist and enjoy.

Activity staff will also utilize the courtyards for grilling burgers to serve at certain meals for individual Neighborhoods.



Another popular location on campus is the *beautiful lake*, which is fully stocked with a variety of fish such as rainbow trout, largemouth



bass, bluegill, and catfish. Members that are able to be safely outdoors independently can go *fishing* at their leisure. Fishing equipment is available for check out from the Activity staff for those wishing to have them on a short or long term basis. Members that require assistance fishing will be taken to the lake

by staff, and also provided the equipment and bait as needed. Again, we ask that everyone



wear a mask and practice social distancing when at the lake. An "X" has been placed on the piers to indicate the number that can be safely gathered at that location.



Activity staff can also provide walks or strolls outdoors, as well as *golf cart rides* for those who can safely transfer in/out of the golf cart.

"Wacky Wednesdays" have returned on the June calendar to provide additional opportunities for Activity staff to take members outdoors for some of these aforementioned activities. If you would like to par-

ticipate in outdoor activities, or have some other special request, contact your Activity Specialist for more details.



We hope to eventually begin to implement small group activities again (bingo, concerts, socials, etc.), as restrictions are eased.

CONTINUED FOCUS ON MEMBER CARE

Due to the ongoing global pandemic, we had to develop alternate means of delivering some of our services. One of those was "curbside" visits from the Finance department (shown at right). A masked representative from Member Finance visits each neighborhood to visit one-on-one with members regarding financial business, implementing infection control precautions between each individual visit.



We voluntarily offered to the Nebraska Infection Control Assessment and Promotion Program, to be a site visit for the University of Nebraska Medical Center's Biocontainment Unit and National Emerging Special Pathogen Training and Education Center (NETEC) to review of our infection control processes, records, precautions, equipment and more in addressing COVID-19. Their visit resulted in positive reinforcement of steps we have taken to protect our members and good discussion. We were pleased to have the opportunity to benefit from their experience and expertise.

In the last week of May, due to having gone no positive cases of COVID-19 for members and staff, we lifted the precaution of keeping members to their neighborhoods, to allow them to walk about the campus (inside and out) with social distancing. Members continue to sport their masks on their walkabouts and it is wonderful to see them in the hallways and common areas again!

Our members' ability to walk outside on our grounds is also made possible by us maintaining a closed campus to visitors. The interest in our Virtual Visitation program has grown by leaps and bounds, keeping our equipment very busy, one reservation after another. We have had a lot of positive feedback from members and families about their virtual visits.

We appreciate the ongoing understanding and compliance of our members, families, and staff as we monitor the ever-changing situation closely and lift or reimplement precautions as deemed necessary for everyone's safety.
