Greetings,

As we head into what we all hope will be a kinder and gentler spring weather pat-

tern than we experienced in 2024, we do so with our annual USVA survey in the rearview mirror. Surveyors completed their onsite visit March 28, and preliminary results were outstanding!

This year's survey was a comprehensive test of our processes, facility, and the overall quality of care we provide in our skilled nursing and domiciliary areas – and NVH made a great showing. This would not have been possible without the outstanding teams we have in every department across the building, from housekeeping and maintenance to nursing and the business office. We also appreciate the kind words members shared with surveyors, as well as the feedback that will help us continuously improve.

Results of the survey are preliminary until the USVA provides a written report later this month, but surveyors were very complimentary of all areas, identifying just one issue in skilled nursing that will be easily addressed if it appears on the final report. There were <u>no</u> areas of concern cited in the domiciliary. When considering how many hours of care we provide every year to members, the tens of thousands of medications given, and all the other working parts that go into ensuring we provide quality care every day, it is an incredible testament to the commitment of our team to have just one area of concern cited by surveyors.

As I mentioned earlier, we are heading into the spring weather season, which means increased chances for severe weather events. We completed one tornado watch/warning drill in late March (it went very well) and there will be more to come in April. We appreciate the efforts of the NVH team and the participation of members as we conduct these drills. Although they can be disruptive to the daily routine, these drills will go a long way to help ensure everyone stays safe in the event of an actual severe weather event.

## HEROES WALL- TRIBUTE TILES


Tribute tiles are displayed in the Flag Plaza located at the front of the Norfolk Veterans Home.
