Garden Corner



Pussy Willow

The pussy willow, a sure harbinger of spring! Pussy willow is a name given to many of the smaller species of the genus Salix (willows and sallows). The fast-growing pussy willow has long been admired for its strong, spreading, upright stems, colorful autumn leaves and iconic purplish-brown catkins that appear in late winter/early spring. The furry catkins are striking on the bare stems, appearing between seasons when gardens can seem rather blah. I have fond memories of my mother sending me out to cut pussy willow "sticks" that grew along the creek that ran through our Michigan farm. We'd put these "sticks" in a vase filled with water. Like magic, the buds opened up into beautiful white catkins. They're not cultivated much in home landscapes, but you might see some blooming in the woods during March. Be looking for them.
