It's dandelion season! Dandelions were introduced to Canada, the United States, Australia, and other countries from Europe hundreds of years ago for use as a medicinal herb. Did you know that every part of the dandelion plant offers unique flavors and nutritional benefits, making it a versatile edible wild green? The leaves are rich in vitamins A, C, and K, and minerals such as iron and potassium. Young leaves are less bitter and are excellent in salads or sautéed as a spinach alternative. And have you ever experienced wine made from dandelions? Although we may not want them in our lawns, they do provide a service. They are critical to bees as dandelions are one of the first flowers in spring that provide food for hungry bees waking up from hibernation. Dandelions in the right places provide beauty.
