During May, June, and July you will find the Yarrow, *achillea millefolium* flower blooming in the north berm under the Swamp Oak tree. Yarrow is a perennial that doesn't mind hot, humid climates. They have fern-like, aromatic, medium green foliage, and tiny, long-lasting, yellow flowers that bloom throughout the summer on stems that reach approximately 2-3 feet tall. Yarrow flowers provide nectar and a habitat for ladybugs and butterflies. We hope you will take the time to visit the gardens by the gazebo and find this unique plant.
