Defining who is a Veteran

Veteran means a person who served in the active military, naval, air, or space service and who was discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable.

- ➤ For compensation and dependency and indemnity compensation the term *veteran* includes a person who died in active service and whose death was not due to wilful misconduct
- > For death pension the term *veteran* includes a person who died in active service under conditions which preclude payment of service-connected death benefits, provided such person had completed at least 2 years honorable military, naval or air service.

Are Guard and Reserve Eligible for Benefits?

All National Guard and Reserve members qualify for some VA benefits. Different benefits may consider different factors to determine eligibility, such as length of service, type of service (such as under Title 10 or Title 32), wartime service, and/or service-related disability.

What is Service Connection?

Compensation benefits are paid for disabilities that are service-connected, which means the injury or disease resulted in a disability linked to military service.

What is Disability Compensation?

Disability compensation is a tax-free monetary benefit paid to veterans with disabilities that are the result of a disease or injury incurred or aggravated during active military service.

You may be eligible for benefits if you are a uniformed servicemember; veteran; or spouse, child, or parent of a deceased or disabled servicemember or veteran.

This brochure describes the minimum VA service connection rating for listed benefits. This list is not all-inclusive and in many cases there are additional requirements for eligibility.
