# Garden Corner



## *Asclepias syriaca*

*Asclepias syriaca*, commonly called common milkweed is a species of flowering plant. It is native to southern Canada and much of the United States east of the Rocky Mountains. Common milkweed grows to nearly six feet tall. They propagate through their underground root system. All parts of common milkweed plants produce a white latex when cut. Their flowers are highly fragrant and are pinkish to purple in color. More than 450 insect species feed on the milkweed including flies, beetles, ants, bees, wasps, and butterflies. It is among the most important food sources for the monarch butterfly caterpillars. There is concern that the declining milkweed plants will severely impact monarch butterflies. To that end, many municipalities are promoting the use of the common milkweed in wild flower settings. And, we have them in our gardens scattered on the berms by the gazebo. Take a look the next time you're back there.
