FLU SHOTS / COVID SHOTS

The weather is getting cooler and closer to fall. This time of year, ENVH holds flu and COVID shot clinics to give to all members that indicated on admission they wanted immunizations. Again, this year, we are happy to partner with Kohll's Pharmacy for these vaccinations. Monday, September 29th starting at 7am in Allegiance Neighborhood then moving to the medical clinic for Honor Neighborhood members is our first day lasting until Noon. Our next opportunity will be Wednesday, October 1st starting at 2pm on Service Neighborhood then moving to Motivation Neighborhood.

If members are going to be at appointments during the scheduled time for their neighborhood, their date for immunization will be moved to accommodate this. All members living at ENVH meet the current COVID shot eligibility to receive one this fall.

Vaccinations are only one step in staying healthy this coming Influenza season. Please wash your hands before eating or drinking, after blowing your nose, or covering your cough. Wear a mask if you have the sniffles. Tell your nursing staff if you are feeling under the weather. Ask your family or friends not to visit if they are sick or have been around someone ill recently. Ask your family or friends to get their vaccinations also. Sanitize your bingo cards and hands before starting activities.

If for some reason you do not want your member at ENVH to receive a flu or COVID vaccination this season, please call the Infection Control Nurse at 402-591 -4881 and leave a message.

Garden Corner

NEBRASKA GOLDENROD





Solidago gigantea is an older botanical name, for the perennial wildflower known today as Giant Golenrod, distinguished by its hairless, glaucous stem and large, plume-like panicles of bright yellow flowers that bloom in late summer and fall. Native to North America, it is a hardy plant found in meadows, woodlands, and along roadsides and is an important food source for insects like the monarch butterfly. It grows to nearly 7 feet and spreads via rhizomes (through roots underground). The goldenrod is the official state flower of Nebraska, adopted on April 4, 1895. The wildflower represents the pioneering spirit and resilience of Nebraska's settlers due to its ability to thrive in harsh conditions and its long growing season. The adoption of the goldenrod as the Nebraska state flower was supported by botanist Dr. Charles Bessey and was signed into law by Governor Silas Holcomb. About the adoption of the goldenrod, Nebraska author Ida Brockman wrote in 1895:

It's in bloom now across several garden areas near the gazebo. And don't worry about pollen; it doesn't pose any allergy issues. Get outside when you can and enjoy them!

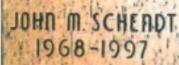
"There is probably not a nook or corner of the state where one or more of the numerous species of goldenrod are not found. It is a native, and only a true native should be our representative. It has a long season, and nothing could better represent the hardy endurance of Nebraska's pioneers."
