Merrymakers Concert & Spring Tea Sponsored By American Legion & Auxiliary






The Custer County American Legion Auxiliary sponsored the "Spring Tea" which featured several garden themed bingo games, and delicious pie and ice cream.



“This & That” - More Fun Filled Days!




New admissions to the Veterans' Home are introduced at "Welcome Bingo & Tea" now scheduled monthly so that we can all get acquainted with our new members.
