

Message from the Administrator

As I mentioned in my last article, March was the month when the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs conducts their annual survey checking on our overall compliance with their policies and procedures as well as other

regulations. We had 6 surveyors that conducted their survey on site over five days. This is a change from the last surveys when, due to COVID restrictions, the annual survey was conducted virtually via a video camera.

We had a few deficiencies and we are working on corrective action plans (CAPs) to address them, but it is important to share two major statements by the surveyors: There were no concerns related to members' care or broken systems, and the care and overall atmosphere in the building are significantly improved since 2021. Thank you to all of you that were working diligently to make these significant improvements for the benefit of our veterans and members!

The weather is warming up day by day, the bitter cold winter is just a memory now, so go ahead and prepare for outdoor activities. Of course, don't forget that we are in Nebraska so weather may take a turn and powerful storms may impact our areas. So stay vigilant!

It is good to note and be thankful that Buffalo County's COVID-19 rates are getting lower, which doesn't require mandated use of masks, both for members and teammates. 
