Message from the Administrator

NMES/VitalStim Therapy - I had prior experience with VitalStim Therapy and I wanted to introduce it as a service for our veterans. VitalStim Therapy is an FDA approved form of Neuromuscular Electrical Stimulation. This method of treatment is a modality used in addition to traditional exercise, when addressing dysphagia management.



This therapy uses small electrical currents to stimulate the muscles responsible for swallowing. Combining the power of electrical stimulation with the benefits of traditional swallowing interventions accelerates the strengthening, restores function, and helps to re-educate the muscles in-

volved in swallowing (deglutition). During the Demo session (shown right), the Administrator was the "demo patient".

A Success Story

On admission of a new CNVH member, the Speech Therapist assessment showed immediate signs of aspiration with thin liquids and difficulty with soft textured foods. "I always seem to cough with water, it's been that way for a long time" the member stated. Speech Therapy utilized the neuromuscular electrical stimulation (VitalStim) treatment for stimulus of and improvement of swallow function and strength. The member has regained the ability to safely swallow a regular diet and thin liquids and is even able to drink out of a straw again!

Cora Linn Foglesong was selected as the "Member of the Month" by the CNVH Member Council and has lived at the










Members have been enjoying a wide variety of activities in the month of August across campus from axe throwing, fishing, bus outings to quilting just to name a few!








Happenings Across Campus

Nebraska State Fair






