Virginia Mountain Mint. Virginia mountain-mint is a stout perennial, becoming multi-branched toward the top of its 2-3 foot height. Tiny, white, mint-like flowers, often spotted with purple, are arranged in numerous small, dense clusters. The clusters, which bloom only a few at a time, arise from the leaf stem tips. The foliage of this leafy plant is covered with a whitish bloom. Its common name of mountain mint is somewhat misleading since the plant typically occurs in moist soils in wet meadows, swamps and along streams and ponds. You'll find this plant in the rain gardens. Insects love them. They make a wonderful pollinator plant. And, yes, they do have a minty aroma. Run your fingers gently across the leaves and give them a sniff. They're in full bloom now. Enjoy them!

August 17th at 10 a.m., we will have our quarterly memorial service for the members we lost in May, June and July.


