For those of us who work in the healthcare industry (especially in caring for the elderly), we deal with death and end of life issues a lot more than the average person. Sometimes people might comment about how hard it must be to do this type of work because so many people that we work with and learn to love will die over the course of our work with them. That is a very significant issue that we deal with. We average about 35 deaths a year here at Eastern Nebraska Veterans' Home, and about 45-50 of the hospice patients that I serve as chaplain will die each year. In my experience, I find that the joy I receive in loving and caring for another person is greater than the grief that I experience when they die. When that is true, it makes it easier to reach out to love and care for yet another person. I pray that you can experience that also as you seek to reach out to love and care for others, even after significant losses in your life.
