Fishing at Gilmore Lake:

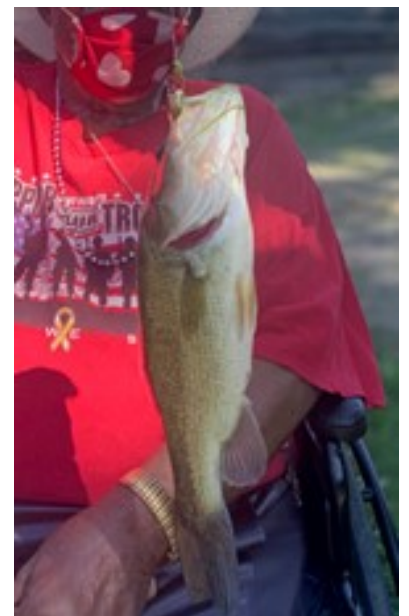
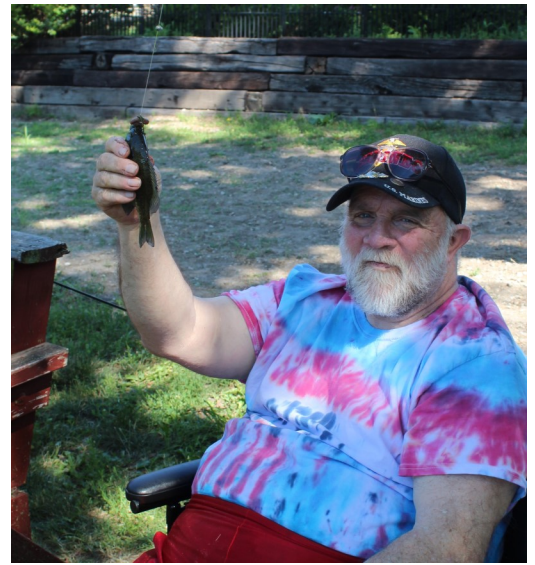
VFW Post 10727 invited the members to their post to do some fishing.

Several years ago I traveled to China with my son to visit my daughter who was an English teacher in China. We spent most of our time in a city about the size of New York City.
