I grew up attending church camp every summer. During the 30+ years that I served as a local church pastor, I served in a week or two of church camp about every summer. Even in the past 15-20 years during which I have been doing chaplain work (here at the veterans' home and with hospice), I have still had the opportunity to speak about every summer at a week or two of church camp. When I was middle-aged, the campers saw more as a parent; but here in later years, they started seeing me more as a grandparent. I have found that to be an interesting transition in how I can relate to them. And it has been mostly positive! It's a reminder to me that one of the blessings and opportunities of aging is that sometimes God gives us a platform on which we can share His wisdom and truth in a way that might be more welcoming. I am reminded of testimony of an older person in Psalm 71:18—"Even when I am old and gray, do not forsake me, O God, till I declare your power to the next generation, your might to all who are to come."
