The month of January brought in 6 different musical acts!






Thank you to all the performers who come in to entertain members at ENVH.

I didn't catch who it was that said it, but I do like this quote—"Rejection of the Image Giver (God) always results in injustice against the Image Bearers (people)." Jesus told us that the greatest commandments for us to live by are these--#1) to love the Lord our God with all of our heart, soul, mind, and strength; 2) to love our neighbor as ourselves (see Mark 12:28-31). When we ignore or reject #1 (about loving God), we likely will have trouble with #2 (loving people). While God created us with the freedom to love and trust Him OR to reject and ignore Him, there are consequences that flow from those choices. If we find ourselves struggling in our love for people, then let's recheck our love for God-there is a direct relationship!
