Message from the Administrator

Well, the summer is gone and we officially entered into the Fall on September 23rd! Two things will make this transition desirable: cooling off from the hot summer and the beginning of the harvest season. In fact, all those teammates that commute to and from the surrounding communities have noticed the abundance of combines,

tractors with trailers and semi-trucks animating the fields.

For Central Nebraska Veterans' Home (CNVH), the month of September was marked with an increased number of applications for new hires, which is always good! We hope this trend will continue especially after October 23rd when CNVH will begin with a new working schedule for the RNs and LPNs. Most healthcare providers in the community of Kearney and the surrounding communities provide 12-hour shifts to their professional nurses. This is a consistent trend on the healthcare labor market that exists in the State of Nebraska as well as many states in the United States. In order to become more attractive to potential future nursing hires (RNs and LPNs), CNVH will modify the traditional 8-hour shifts to 12-hour shifts for select job classifications.

In addition to making us more attractive on the labor market by implementing 12-hour nursing shifts, we also aim to reduce the need for mandatory overtime as well as our reliance on third party agency staff, while providing a better work-life balance for our nurses. As a result, we have been working with the Human Resources team, Scheduling and Nursing leadership to develop a new staffing schedule we believe will allow CNVH to continue to serve veterans at the highest level while providing more attractive scheduling options for our current and future nurses.

Switching gears here, it is good to share that CNVH is part of a two-year pilot with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs regarding available mental healthcare (MH) for those members in need of such care. The first meeting of this pilot was on September 12th and including CNVH, there are four State Veterans Homes (SVH) that signed up as MH Pilot sites. In addition to the Central Nebraska Veterans' Home and the Norfolk Veterans' Home, the Maine Veterans' Home – Bangor and the New Hampshire Veterans' Home in Tilton are participating.

One last item of news, Kearney Rotary Club is planning to donate around 20 trees to replace the ones that had died in the past year. They already delivered seven of the trees that will be planted this month of October by our maintenance crew as well as Rotarian volunteers.

Walter Moore was selected as "Member of the Month" by the CNVH Member Council. Walter has been with CNVH since 2019. Walter was born and raised in




Kearney, graduating in 1960 and attended some college. He has one daughter and two sons.
