# Nebraska Veterans Aid

Nebraska Veterans Aid (NVA) was established in 1921 to assist veterans and their dependents who experience a financial hardship. NVA is administered by the Nebraska Department of Veterans' Affairs (NDVA) and may be requested through your local County Veterans Service Officer (CVSO) to assist in paying for food, rent/mortgage, utilities, eye glasses, hearing aids, preapproved dental bills, medical bills, transportation, daycare, and funeral expenses when normal payment methods have been exhausted.



## Eligibility

To be eligible, you must be a veteran with honorable service and active duty service other than for training, or the dependent of a veteran. This information can be found on an appropriate discharge document such as a DD-214. If in doubt, you may contact your CVSO for assistance.

Additionally, you must demonstrate that you are experiencing a current financial hardship that was caused by a temporary emergency that generally was no fault of your own, such as a medical episode or catastrophic life event.

## How Do I Apply?

To apply, you should collect necessary paperwork such as your DD-214 and current bills that you are requesting assistance with and see your local CVSO. It is often helpful to look up your CVSO's office hours or call ahead with questions. ## How Much Am I Eligible To Receive?

Upon receiving your application, NDVA will compare your income to your expenses in consideration of your emergency. If eligible, you may receive an amount equal to the need for living expenses, medical bills, or funeral up to the maximum allowed. Applications are generally processed in seven to ten days if the application is complete upon arrival at NDVA.
