Members & Staff Show Resilience In The Face Of A Nationwide Pandemic

Members and staff at the Central Nebraska Veterans' Home are showing their resilience as they face the COVID-19 Pandemic that has struck the nation.

- The Foxhole is teaming up with Recreation and Social Work staff to provide delivery of items directly to members several times a week.



- Coordination and compilation of departmental and administrative reports and interactions with the Health Department/CDC.
- Staff from various departments are helping with tasks in Food Services.
- Everyone is wearing masks (thanks to all of our donors of the fabric masks!).
- We maintain a 6 foot distance from each other as much as possible.



Resilience is defined as the ability to recover from, or adjust to, misfortune or change.



It is a normal human reaction to resist change. However, when given the facts of the reality of a situation, it becomes vitally important that we shift from "resistance" to "resilience". Members and staff are **exhibiting our resilience** every day, as we work together in the realities of this pandemic.

Consider all of the **many changes** that we have implemented in the past 6—8 weeks to implement precautions against the COVID-19 virus:

- All volunteers and visitors continue to be restricted from campus.
- All staff are checked for illness (temps and survey questions) as they enter the facility before their shift and again as they leave the facility at the end of their shift. 
- All members are restricted to their homes/rooms, including eating their meals in their rooms.
- Staff from a variety of departments are assisting with serving meal trays to each room, 3 times a day, 7 days a week.
- All activities are implemented room to room. Craft sessions are also delivered to each room. 
- Members are connecting with loved ones "virtually" instead of in person.
- Finance is providing "banking" in each home

These are just a few examples of the many ways we've had to adjust to this world of change we are experiencing every day!

Being resilient isn't a new skill for most of our members, as **during their lifetimes they have experienced many hardships**. From those who endured the **Great Depression**, to those who encountered the **rationing** of essential items during WWII to help with the war effort, to those who dealt with the uncertainties of the **Cold War** era, to those who lived through the **divisive unrest** during the Vietnam War, to those who dealt with the anxiety and War on Terror **after 9-11**: Being resilient in the face of a changing world is what has helped us overcome adversity and **keep our nation free and strong**.

With the reality that a peak in cases of the virus is predicted in our area during the month of May, our lives will continue to be impacted. **Our resilience** will see us through to the other side of this pandemic!

A team of staff from the Foxhole, Recreation, Social Work, and Finance assure that each order is processed and prepared for delivery to individual members.




Have Carts—Will Travel—Room to Room!
