ANNUAL CAR & BIKE SHOW TAKES A BRAKE FOR 2020 (spelled for the pun!)



Animals featured in this display included white-tail deer, wild turkey, brown bear, wild boar, prairie dogs, pronghorn antelope, and a coyote.


COUNTY FAIR WEEK
