


Staff meals will be served at the following times:



Discontentment comes naturally, but contentment has to be learned. Many people live under the assumption that is seen in these phrases: "I would be content if only
." Or "I will be content when ." The

blanks are usually filled in with words that describe getting more money or stuff, with changing the circumstances or relationships in our lives.

But what if our circumstances and relationships don't change? Is contentment still possible IN SPITE OF what is going on in our lives.

The apostle Paul suggested that in these words: "I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do everything through him (Christ) who gives me strength." (Philippians 4:12-13)

People in which I most often observe contentment seem to be people who also demonstrate a strong trust and relationship with God regardless of the current circumstances in their lives. If you are still discontent, where are you trying to find it?
